Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) Situational Report

Report No.022 Date of Issue: 21st April, 2020, 6pm GMT

HIGHLIGHTS

- As at 21st April 2020, there were 50 confirmed and two probable COVID-19 cases reported in Sierra Leone
- **Seven new** confirmed COVID-19 cases have been reported in the last 24 hours
- Six cases have recovered
- This is the second week of inter-district travel restrictions
- MOHS with support of health sector partners continue preparing district health management teams to play an active role in COVID-19 response




- The number of COVID-19 cases has increased steadily over the last one week
- This increase can be attributed to two clusters of cases; one among health workers (from a non-COVID designated hospital) and the other among secondary contacts of the case 2
- The first cases reported in Kenema and Tonkolili districts were among persons who recently travelled from Western Area Urban
- The highest number of cases so far, was reported on 17th April, 2020








Reported COVID-19 Cases in Sierra Leone as at 21st April, 2020

- Thirty- Five (67.3 %) of cases are from Western Area Urban
- A new cluster was identified in Western Area Urban today
- All cases reported in the last 24 hours are from Central 1 Zone, Western Area Urban

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION / RESPONSE INTERVENTIONS

COORDINATION

- Daily technical and operational coordination meetings held at the PHNEOC
- Activation of district emergency operations centres has started
- MoHS and partners are conducting visits to prepare district teams for COVII-19 response
- Security personnel manning quarantine facilities lack accommodation. Upcoming rainy season may aggravate the situation

SURVEILLANCE

- Training of 96 case investigators completed
- The number of contacts being followed up has increased markedly over the last one week
- Inadequate security personnel to man all quarantine facilities
- Inadequate quarantine facilities to accommodate all travellers and other contacts placed under quarantine

HAZARD CONTAINMENT (GOVERNMENT RESTRICTIONS)

- Inter-district travel restrictions in place starting 11th April 2020
- Ban on mass gatherings, closure of learning institutions and travel restrictions remain in effect

IPC and CASE MANAGEMENT

- Training of security personnel in Kambia district on basic IPC
- Current bed capacity designated for management of COVID-19 patients is 100 and out of these, 43 are occupied

RISK COMMUNICATION, COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & SOCIAL MOBILISATION

- Community resistance encountered by public health officials during case investigation and transfer of cases to treatment centre. This was resolved amicable through dialogue
- Welfare visits conducted to support health workers placed under quarantine

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Complete decentralization orientation visits to the districts and prepare districts to play an active role in COVID-19 subnational response
- Resolve issue of identification cards for contact tracers
- EOC Leadership to facilitate the provision of tents for security officers deployed to man quarantine facilities
- Risk communication to deliver more sensitization messages to promote awareness raising on COVID 19
