#### WEEKLY NATIONAL EPIDEMIOLOGICAL BULLETIN

#### Disease specific report

- Acute Flaccid Paralysis: One (1) case of acute flaccid paralysis was reported this week. The case was an under five child from Kambia district. The district RRT investigated the case, samples were collected and sent to the CPHRL.
- Animal bite: In total, 19 animal bite cases were reported from eleven districts. Of the total cases reported, (1) was under five and (18) five years. The highest number of cases were reported from Kono and Moyamba (4) each, whiles Kailahun and Kenema (2) each per district..
- Acute Viral Haemorrhagic Fever (AVHF): Two (2), case of suspected AVHF were reported during the week. The cases aged above five were reported from Kenema district. Samples were collected and tested. Both cases were positive for Lassa fever but negative for EVD and Marburg.
- Maternal death: Six (6) maternal deaths were reported countrywide from 5 districts, during this week. Kenema (2) whiles Bonthe, Port Loko, Tonkolili and Western Area Urban reported (1) each per district.
- Measles: One (1) case of suspected measles was reported this week.
   The case was aged above 5 years from Western Area Rural. The district RRT investigated the case, collected sample and sent to the
   CPHRL for confirmation
- Yellow Fever: One (1), suspected case of Yellow Fever was reported during the week. The case was aged above five from Kailahun district. The district RRT investigated the case, collected sample and sent to CPHRL for confirmation



#### **KEY HIGHLIGHTS FOR COVID-19 FOR THE WEEK**

- Confirmed cases: 279 confirmed cases of COVID-19 were reported during this week, of which, 217 were males and 62 were females
- COVID-19 Death: Two (2) COVID-19 related deaths were reported this week. Pujehun and Western Area Urban (1) each per district
- COVID-19 Recovery: A total of 55 recoveries were reported for this week. Western Area Urban (44) and Western Area Rural (8), Bombali (2) whiles Bo, (1) per districts
- COVID-19 Quarantine: Cumulative quarantine nationwide for this week were (509), of which, self quarantine (485) and Organization (24)
- Quarantine discharge: Eleven (11) contacts were discharged from quarantine this week. Self Quarantined (7), Organization (3) and Government (1).

Influenza Sentinel Surveillance: In week three of the year, 35 suspected Influenza samples were collected from the sites. Of the total samples, one (1) tested positive for COVID-19



### COVID-19 cumulative confirmed cases by district Week 4, 2021




For the period of week 04, a total of 279 confirmed COVID-19 cases were reported countrywide, an increase from 120 in the previous week. Western Area Urban accounting for the highest number of cases 2,026 (55.5%) closely followed by Western Area Rural 621 (17.0%) of total cases countrywide. Western Area Urban and Rural now constitute over 70% of the total cases countrywide

### COVID-19 Laboratory confirmed cases by Week of diagnosis, since the last five weeks 2020 & 2021 Sierra Leone




Laboratory confirmed cases of COVID-19 continue to be on the increase in the past weeks with week four of this year showing the highest, however, there is a reduction of cases in week 3. These increases are significantly seen in the Western Areas as shown on the table above.





### Cumulative Animal Bite (dogs) Cases reported by districts Week 1 - 4, 2021



A total of 19 Animal bite cases were reported in week 04 of the year. A decrease from 24 in the previous week. The highest number of case were from Moyamba and Kono (4) each, and Kailahun and Kenema (2) whiles Karene, Koinadugu, Port Loko, Pujehun, Tonkolili, Western Area Urban and Western Area Rural (1)each per districts. So far, only Falaba districts have not reported a event of animal bite

# Compared Animal Bite (dogs) Cases reported by year Week 1 - 4, (2019, 2020 & 2021)




#### Cumulative Maternal Deaths reported by districts Week 1- 4, 2021




A total of 6 maternal deaths were reported in week 04 of the year, an increase from 5 in the previous week, from Five districts, Kenema (2) whiles Bonthe, Port Loko, Tonkolili and Western Area Urban reported (1) each per district. Bo district accounts for the highest death 4 (16%) of the overall cases followed by Bombali, Port Loko, Bonthe and Kailahun (3) deaths each per district. So far, Kono, Moyamba and Western Area Rural have not reported a death.

# Compared Maternal Deaths by year Week 1 - 4, (2019, 2020 & 2021)




In week 4 of this year, less deaths were reported compared to previous two years. Comparatively, 2021 has reported less deaths for the period under review as against 2019 and 2020.

### Call Volume by Category all Districts (EPI week 4)



From the overall call volume by category for week 4 of 2021, a greater portion of calls were related to deaths 48.5 % closely followed by suspected illness related to COVID-19 25.6% and Travelers calling to seek advise on issues relating to their travel 19.1%,
